ADDITIONAL SPEAKERS' DETAILS AND PRESENTATION SUMMARIES

Dr Binita Kane is a Consultant Respiratory Physician at Manchester University Foundation Trust (MFT). She has an interest in airways disease, quality improvement (QI) and leadership. She is currently the lead for integrated respiratory care at MFT, the Greater Manchester COPD Health Innovation Programme and the North West Severe Asthma Network. She is a member of the PCRS Service Delivery Committee, RCP QI Faculty and the National Asthma and COPD Audit Programme (NACAP) Board.

Dr Karen Sheares is a Respiratory Consultant in the Pulmonary Vascular Diseases Unit in Royal Papworth Hospital, and Addenbrooke's Hospital, Cambridge. Areas of research interest include pulmonary hypertension, acute and chronic thromboembolism, and she is the Respiratory expert on the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence's Venous Thromboembolic Diseases Guidelines Group.

Professor Jacky Smith is a Professor of Respiratory Medicine at the University of Manchester and an Honorary Consultant at the University Hospital of South Manchester NHS Foundation Trust. She has more than 15 years of experience running a specialist cough service and in clinical trials assessing novel therapies for cough.
